The Dedication of Voyageur Beach Lieutenant Charley "Tuna" Turner, USN

TO: BOY'S Life Magazine FROM: Chris Turner, Senate Research (296-4350) DATE: July 12, 1991

Dear Sirs:

I have been informed that you are interested in doing a story about my brother, Lt. Charley Turner. That is very flattering, particularly as my entire family has been involved in the Boy Scouts for years and myself and my three brothers all grew up reading your magazine. I have outlined the basic facts about Charley below. Myself, my two older brothers, my parents and Charley's friends would all be happy to speak with you further and provide photos. If necessary.

Charley was born August 3, 1961, the youngest of four boys. We grew up in Richfield, Minnesota, taking every opportunity we could to head up to northern Minnesota to hunt and fish. We all went into cub scouts, then boy scouts. My mother was a den mother and my father a scoutmaster. Michael, Mitchell and myself all became

Eagle scouts. Charley, wanting to be his own man, came within one merit badge of Eagle and then stopped. We all worked as counselors at Many Point Scout Camp in northern Minnesota. Mike and Mitch, who are identical twins, worked at camp from 1969 to 1972. I worked there from 1973 to 1975, and Charley worked there from 1976 to 1982. Charley was one of the best counselors to ever work the camp, and one of the most well liked. He was a program aide, a commissioner, and, in his last years, a waterfront director. His empathy with children and teenagers, his enthusiasm, his natural teaching abilities, his knowledge of the woods and scouting skills and his sense of humor were unparalleled. Testimony to this is the fact that over 100 former camp staffers attended his funeral last March, and the camp is renovating and renaming the beach he directed "Turner Beach."

Charley attended the University of Minnesota, graduating in 1984 with a B.A. in European History. (continued on page 2.) <u>Upcoming</u>

TURNER CONTINUED:

He applied for placement in the Navy's Air Officer's Candidate School in Pensacola, was accepted, and in May of 1985 received his commission as a U.S. Navy Officer. He attended flight school in Pensacola, and was assigned to fly the A6-E Intruder, the navy's premier carrier based attack plane, as a bombardier/ navigator. He was attached to squadron VA-155 (the Silver Foxes) based out of Oak Harbor, Washington. He loved what he did.

With the onset of Desert Shield on August 2, 1990, we were more concerned about Michael than Charley. A navy doctor, Michael was sent with one of the first Marine brigades to Saudi Arabia. Thankfully, he was rotated home for medical reasons in November. On December 8. 1990, Charley shipped out for the Gulf aboard the carrier U.S.S.. Ranger. The enclosed excerpts from his diary, will tell you more about how he felt about the war and his role than I can. He and his pilot were shot down the evening of January 18, 1991, after completing a bombing mission over the port facility of Umm Qasr, Iraq. He was listed as missing in action until March 13, 1991, when the Iraqi government



turned his 'remains over to the International Red Cross. This ended two months of hope 'that he was either a POW or evading the enemy on the ground. He and his pilot, Lt. Tom Costen of St.

Louis, were both awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, naval aviation's highest honor.

Charley was married with a five month old son when he shipped out. He will be sorely missed by all who knew him. He was a naval officer, a husband, a father, a son, a brother and a friend. He served his country well and is as fine an example 'of what the Boy Scouts of America are about as I can think of. He would be flattered that you are interested in his story.

My 29th birthday was the day before yesterday and my life is just beginning with my beautiful newlywed wife and newborn son. My excitement level is rising with current events yet I am not a fool. Combat may very well await me on this upcoming cruise and I vearn to prove my skills and training in the arena. Yet I've always known.that the only glory in war is in surviving. And oh how much I have to survive for these days. Everything about my family life is wonderful. Yeah, I love what I've got and I don't want to lose it but my duty calls and irrational as it may sound, I may have to put it all on the line in the name of duty to my country. That is really a silly and romantic thing to say but such cliches are what makes a good movie, and I'd hate to disappoint anyone. If Saddam were smart none of this would be necessary.
