

Here is a testimonial from one long time Family Camper and what Family Camp has meant to her family:

Our son was a Scout who attended Many Point for several years. When he went the second year, our three daughters and I stayed in a cabin on the lake at "Family Camp" while my husband and our son were in tents "Scout-side." We stayed at family camp every year until our children became counselors rather than campers. What made Family Camp so enjoyable were the activities. Family Camp is how my husband and I grew up. We were outside, playing, making our own fun with our friends. Family Camp has a swimming are, a place to fish, a playground, tether ball, and all sorts of activities run by the counselors. The kids get to decide what to do. So much of a kid's activities today are in front of a screen or in structure activities run by adults. It's nice when kids get the chance to explore. The counselors lifeguard and make sure the children are safe when sailing and boating. They run arts and craft programs, and they are available to play tether ball or help with fishing or other activities. Within a day or two, they know the names of all the campers. One of my favorite memories from Family Camp was of seeing my daughter and two other girls tip over a boat so it turtled (sail was pointed straight down in the water). The immediate reaction of the girls was to wave for help, but the wise counselor signaled to them to try to

get the sail back up. It was a moment of victory for those girls when they were able to get that sail back up!

The cabins have beds and a kitchen, and there are two bathhouses. You wake up in the morning and look out on a pristine lake. You walk at night and see the Milky Way. Family Camp was our way to afford going to the cabin, but it was so much more with all the activities. I'll still visit Many Point from time to time. I use to say that week at Many Point was the most relaxing week of the entire year form. I needed that week, too! -Kathy Longar

REMEMBERING STAFF

As we prepare for a summer of healing, we continue to remember our friends and family on the Many Point Staff. The seemingly complex things in life became so simple, and the simple things in life became so cherished. We'd like to tip our hats and celebrate the life of the people who help make Many Point so great!

Rev. Dr. James (Jim) Pleasant Breeden, 85, passed away peacefully at his home in Easthampton, MA on September 20, 2020, surrounded by family. A lifelong educator and civil rights activist, Jim was noted for his expansive intellect, memorable eloquence, calm presence and steadfast commitment to social justice. Breeden worked at Many Point from 1950-1956.

Harry Woodward, on October 17, 2020, a victim of Covid-19. At the time of his death, Harry was a resident of Lyngblomsten's memory care unit following a devastating brain aneurism in 2008. He was born on May 6, 1944 to Mary Lou (nee Loomis) and Joe Woodward in Fargo, N.D. Both Harry's parents pre-deceased him. He is survived by his wife, Mary (nee Beckman), older sister, Mary Jo Kline, son, Nathanial (Amy), daughter, Elizabeth Boykin (Sean) and six grandchildren. Harry worked at Many Point from 1963-1965.

Peter Bollig, Age 30 of Coon Rapids passed away unexpectedly Sunday Dec. 13, 2020. He attended St. Hubert Catholic Grade School and graduated from Holy Family Catholic High School, Victoria, in 2008. He received his BS in Mechanical Engineering from the University of St. Thomas in 2013. Peter grew up as an active member of Boy Scouts of America, Troop 479 and received the rank of Eagle Scout. He spent numerous summers as a counselor at Many Point Scout Camp. Peter worked at Many Point from 2005-2006, 2009-2012.

Pete Thomes, 61, of Brainerd, Minnesota died Tuesday, January 26, 2021 after a courageous battle with cancer. Pete was born in Buffalo, MN on December 5, 1959, son of Ray and Barbara (Pluth) Thomes. He was raised and educated in Buffalo, graduating from Buffalo High School in 1978 and then attended St. John's University. He was proud to be active in the Boy Scouts of America and achieved the rank of Eagle Scout at age 16. Pete also worked as staff at Many Point Scout Camp from 1976-1982.

Arlene "Granny" Arvola passed away on February 3rd, 2021. Arlene graduated from Menahga School in 1963 and moved to Minneapolis and was employed at Archer Daniels Midland and Northwest Airlines. In October of 1969 she married Kenneth Arvola. Later they moved to Menahga where she gained employment at the Menahga School as the head cook. Arlene served the children at the school for 34 years and loved every minute of it. In the summers Arlene would go to Many Point Scout Camp where she was the head cook for 30 years. Granny worked from 1980-1987, took a break, and returned from 1997 to 2018.
